
Dear Comrade,

I feel a high-time to bring certain facts to your information and necessary action. If the matter is not checked now there is every possibility of so many complications arising in future.

As a registered Union of Andhra Pradesh Temporary Maistries we are representing pursuing and dealing matters and issues involved in Employment of temporary Maistries in various Deptt. of Govt. of Andhra Pradesh since 1958. No-doubt for the time being our activities are confined to the extent of Telengana Region, but much interest is taken in the activities of Head Quarter Circle. We are astonished to read a News in "Deccan Chronicle" that the Highways Employees Union is arranging for a strike for achievement of demands of Gangs and T.Ms. There is possibility of clash of ideas and demands represented by both the Union for similar category. Further to your information that it was specifically agreed previously that the Highways Employees will not interfere in the interest and demands of the Telengana Maistries.

Such step of the Secretary, Highways Employees Union as pointed above is very objectionable and quite against the agreement reached. Instructions may be issued from your office to the Secretary, Highways Employees Union (Com. Swamy) to refrain from committing such irregular actions hereafter and direct him to issue a clarifying statement in the Press accordingly.

Thanking you and expecting an early and favourable action with a kind reply at an early date.



Sri. K. L. Narasimhan, President and Com. H. Satyanarayana Reddy, General Secretary of the Andhra Pradesh Trade Union Congress has issued the following joint statement:-

1700 workers of the Bajrang Jute Mills Guntur have been relentlessly struggling by continuing their 76 days long 100% united strike demanding implementation of Government decision on the Jute Wage Board recommendations.

In 1961 the Jute Wage Board was appointed after 1 1/2 years delay after the Government decision for its appointment. The Government issued orders in October, 1963 directing all the Managements of Jute mills in the State to implement the decisions of the Wage Board with effect from JULY, 1963.

The Guntur and Eluru Jute Mills workers Unions made every possible effort through representations to get the Government decisions implemented by the Managements. State Government advised Managements to implement its orders but the Managements adopted adamant and arrogant attitude and refused to implement the wage board recommendations.

The workers having no other way, after the failure of Government, as a last resort went on Strike to induce the Managements to implement the decisions of the Wage Boards. For 20 days the Government remained a silent spectator and then referred the matter to adjudication, as to whether the workers demands to implement the Jute Wage Board recommendations are justified. The Government instead of moving firmly to get the Wage Board decisions implemented has adopted this subtle method to vitiate the recommendations of the Wage Board. It is strange to constitute the Industrial Tribunal of Andhra Pradesh to adjudicate on the unanimous findings of the highest wage fixing authority in the Country, appointed by the Government of India. This is one of the concrete examples of the anti-labour policies of the Government.

The Government that failed to enforce its own orders has no moral or ethical right to prohibit the Strike of the workers which is aim at enforcing the orders of the Government.

Taking immoral and unjust advantage of the strike prohibition orders of the Government the Management secured the approval of the Industrial Court to dismiss all the workers numbering 1706 with effect from 13th April, 1964. And now the Management is serving notices of eviction on 400 families of the workers to render them homeless and thus further force them to bow them down.

It may be mentioned that the Unions both at Guntur and Eluru have offered to call-off the strike provided the Management accept to implement their own earlier partial wage rise offer as INTERIM RELIEF pending final settlement, that is linking Dearness Allowance with Cost of Living Index, payment of Special Wage Board recommendation of Rs 4.91/1p per worker, adding to the Basic wage of every worker Rs 2.30 Np and accepting the Bonus decision.

The Managements are not prepared to implement their own offers, therefore workers had no other alternative but to continue the struggle. The Jute Mills workers struggle is in fact a part of the struggle of the working class which it is waging all over the Country for linking DA, for wage rise and payment of proper Bonus. It is also a fight against the anti-labour and pro-capitalist policy of the Government. Therefore the Andhra Pradesh Trade Union Congress appeals to all the Trade Unions and working people irrespective of their political affiliations and views to extend their full support to the cause and struggle of Jute workers.

These 1700 low paid workers whose all inclusive wage is Rs52/-monthly are struggling for the last 42 days. The APTUC therefore appeals to all the Trade Unions to immediately send liberal donations to Bajrang Jute Mills worker-Guntur.

The APTUC urges upon the State Government to take immediate steps to get this dispute settled.



SUBJECT: HIGH LEVEL INTERVENTION TO IMPLEMENT JUTE WAGE BOARDS  
RECOMMENDATIONS BY BAJRANG JUTE MILLS GUNTUR? A.P.

Honourable Sir,

We are writing this letter to confirm our personal  
representation to you on 23-5-1964.

The Central Wage Board for the Jute Industry, which was appointed in 1960 submitted its unanimous recommendations in October, 1963.

The Central and State Governments having approved these unanimous recommendations of the Wage Board directed the Jute Mills managements, in October and November, 1963, respectively to implement the Board decisions immediately.

Accordingly the Commissioner of Labour convened three Joint meetings to persuade the Managements of the Jute Mills in the State to implement the decisions.

The Management of the Bajrang Jute Mills Guntur with two others mills refused to honour the Tripartite decisions and the Government directives.

In order to induce the Management to honour the Government directives the workers commenced strike from 2nd March 1964 which is continuing even today in its 84th day.

It is strange that the Government, which approved the decisions of the Wage Board and directed the Managements repeatedly to implement them, have suddenly changed their stand and referred the matter to the State Industrial Tribunal to sit in judgement over the decisions of the highest Tripartite Wage fixing authority in the Country and simultaneously prohibited the Strike!

Taking advantage of this Reference and the Prohibition of the Strike the Management with the technical approval of the Tribunal served dismissal orders on all the 1706 workers and now trying to get evicted from the Mills colonies 200 families of the workers.

The Government could have taken the powers under Section 17 A of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 to stay or modify the dismissal approval order of the Tribunal and thus prevented the arrogant Management from attacking the just struggle of the workers. But the Government has remained a silent spectator.

The vindictiveness of the Management could be gauged from their approach to the High Court to stay the payment of Provident Fund Loans to starving workers.

The Union has repeatedly offered to call off the Strike provided the Management implements its offer which it made during the negotiations at the level of the Commissioner of Labour, as an interim measure. But they have refused to do so.

It is high time therefore that your honour intervenes personally to help in promoting an amicable settlement immediately.

We thank you for your kind assurance to convene a Joint meeting at your level by specially deputing one of the top officers for this purpose.

We highly appreciate your view to get the Wage Boards' decisions enforced Statutorily.




